




In base I this week our focus text has been 'Ellies Magic Wellies' We went on a welly walk to the local lake and saw some swans.


We have also been learning about harvest through painting pictures of fruit and vegetables and creating our own pumpkin patch.




In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds from set I.

In maths we have been sorting objects into size order, finding what group of objects has more or less and our ten town number of the week is 7.



In history, we have been exploring the changes in toys. We have looked at how changes happen and placing the changes on a timeline.





# <u>This week in Seahorses</u>

Last week the children got chance to take part in learning to street dance! They loved the experience!








Computing In computing we have learnt how to use the trackpad to open a previously saved file.

# This week in Dophins...




#### Literacy

This week in literacy we have continued to learn about nonchronological reports. We have used all of our learning to plan and write our own non-chronological reports. We used our learning to ensure we included all the key features and remembered our punctuation in our independent writes.

#### Maths

In maths we have began our learning on fractions. We began by revisiting recognising equal groups and then moved on to finding a half using arrays to help us.



#### Geography

In geography this week, we learnt the symbols for recording weather for a weather forecast. We then played 'Matching Symbols' memory game to find matching pairs of the symbol to its meaning. Next, we looked at how a weather presenter on the TV reads the symbols in front of them to read the weather forecast, before finally becoming weather reporters ourselves!




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## Star Player of the week award
