DOGs:


No dog should be on the school premises at any time, whether on a lead or being carried. This is part of a school policy. Please adhere to this.

This week in Turtles Class.....






In Read Write Inc this week we have been learning our new sounds from set 1.




In Literacy we have been writing some words using the sounds we have been learning in our phonics. We have been reminded to use our Fred fingers and pinchers to find the sounds in the word.




Literacy






We also created our own poppies for remembrance week.

In Maths children have been learning to measure Time. They learnt to tell the time o'clock, half past,

quarter past and quarter to. They learnt the difference between the minute hand and the hour hand, and that when the minute hand makes it's way around the clock face, the hour hand goes slowly to the next hour. Children en-

Literacy

In Literacy children have been learning the story Peace Lily. A story about a girl called Lily who wanted to be a nurse. Her dream becomes real when she takes the brave decision to follow her childhood friends, soldiers Ben and Ray, to the dangerous battlefields of Western France. Children have been learning about all the roles



that women have played in World War I, including working in factories, on farms and nursing. Children are continuing their knowledge of non-chronological reports, by writing an information text titled "Women's Roles in WWI".

History

To immerse into our new history study, the children enjoyed creating a fireworks display outdoors using water! We then created firework paintings back in the class to see the vibrant colours of fireworks. During the memorable experience, we asked the children whether they celebrated bonfire night, if they were going to see the fireworks later and if they knew



why bonfire night was celebrated and who Guy Fawkes was before revealing our big question... Was Guy Fawkes a hero or a villain? We also completed a series of activities to secure our understanding and recall upon prior knowledge before diving into our new history study of the Gunpowder plot. First, we la-







belled the United Kingdom with its 4 countries and the capital city of England. Then, we annotated our understanding of the role of a Monarch. After, we took turns deciding new laws and how we would use them to run the country with. Finally, we compared images of London in the 1600s and modern London


