I was so impressed with the children's behaviour and the respect shown from the audience (Parents and families). It was a wonderful feeling, seeing the children perform with confidence and joy. Our aim was solely to spread some happiness, whilst reducing the stress that performances can cause for both children and staff. I am so proud of all the children in our school. These events enrich the curriculum and allow education to take place both inside and outside of the classroom. I believe that the atmosphere created by going to the church was the best. The children's enthusiasm and joy at this time of year is what makes it all worthwhile. The joy and happiness shared at this time of year is overwhelming and it is the children who make this possible. They are the best gift you could ask for. Cherish them and treasure every moment. We have also been enjoying our Tomte theme over the last two weeks, children have taken their Tomte on a journey through a winter themed story. They have produced some amazing work and fabulous artwork.

We have achieved so much this term, and the teachers take on all new initiatives with enthusiasm and passion. We have implemented many changes to ensure we meet the actions outlined in our recent Ofsted. We have revised our foundation curriculum and have new progression grids for all subjects. Middle leaders have been monitoring their subjects and all staff have worked incredibly hard to ensure the curriculum is delivered to a high standard. We have seen huge improvements in the delivery of the music curriculum and the children are enjoying 'Musician of the month' and learning new songs. Singing takes place every week in every year group. Geography and History continue to improve and there is clear progression in books. We are focusing on Art throughout the Spring term and our PD day 6th January 2025 is being delivered by an Art specialist, who will help our school shape the art curriculum and inspire the staff. Literacy and maths continue to improve and good progress is evident. Governors have regularly attended school to monitor behaviour, safeguarding, maths, and the foundation subjects. All governors have a line of enquiry linked to the Ofsted action plan and are responsible for monitoring and evaluating this area.



Everyone enjoyed the Christmas theatre performance of 'Dick Whittington' it was a great morning. The children were laughing and interacting along with the performers. This term we have been promoting the value 'RESPECT'. All staff have raffle tickets to give to children when they show respect in many different forms. The tickets are put into our tombola and three are drawn every half term and they each receive a prize. We have also implemented the 100% club for attendance.
