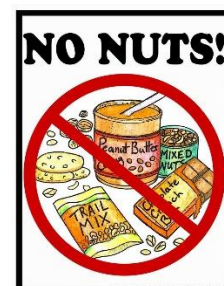

Dear Parents and Carers,

NUT ALLERGY:

Could I please ask that you do not send food with nuts in for your child's packed lunch or for a break-time snack. This week in Seals...

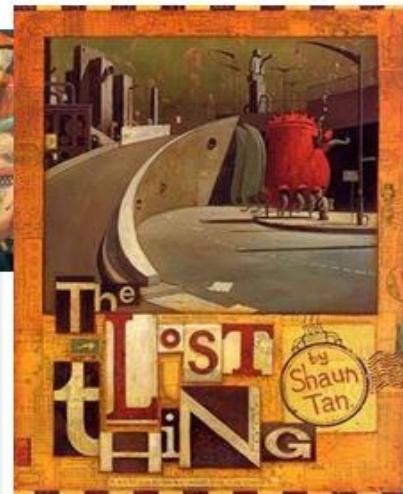
In History...

We continued our work on the Ancient Greeks. We have created maps of the Ancient Greek world, timeline of important phases and compared the city states of Athens and Sparta.

Maths –

In maths this week we have continued to deepen our understanding of place value- hundreds, tens and ones. We learnt to quickly find one, ten and hundred more or less than a number and recognised that only one-digit changes.



School Parliament!

On Thursday we voted for our class representative for School Parliament. We spend the week learning about democracy, preparing our manifestos and making rosettes to wear around school! We thought about what a good member of School Parliament would need and listened to candidates' speeches before taking part in the ballot!

This week in Belugas...

Writing –

This week we learnt to structure our writing into paragraphs. Children have learnt that when there is a new theme, character, time or location, they must start a new paragraph, all, whilst taking particular notice of their handwriting!



Maths –

We continued our unit on place value. Children have learnt to compare and order numbers to 10,000! Creating their own numbers greater or less than a given number and considering which column they need to compare first!



Art

In Art we learnt about negative and positive space in an image of a silhouette. Children learnt the grid method to enlarge a picture and were able to accurately recreate the dog silhouettes. Next, children will reinforce their pictures with corrugated card and prop them up with a base, turning them for a 2D picture to a 3D sculpture!

Each Base has nominated two children for this week's homework of the week award

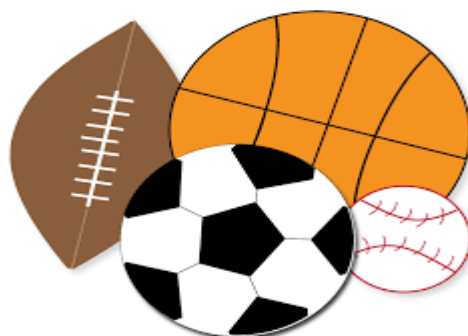
