KEY STAGE 1 NEWS



In Base 1 this week children have been reading the story 'Oliver's vegetables', and creating their own story books. In maths children have been practicing finding one more than/one less than a given number. Base 1 have also been looking after their broad beans that they planted a few weeks ago that are now starting to sprout.

Base 2 this week children have been working on Division in maths and using the sharing and grouping method to help them solve the answers to sums. In Literacy children have been planning and writing their own Kennings Poems about animals.



This week in literacy Base 3 have been writing kennings poem. The poems had 2 words on each line and they had to be a noun and then a verb. Children wrote a kennings poem about a black cat. In maths children have been carrying out division using the bar method. In art Base 3 have been researching and painting

In Maths Base 4 have been learning to find fractions of amounts using the bar model and their times tables to help. Children have also been using the bar model to recognise equivalent fractions. In science this week children carried out their independent cross investigation and recorded their results in their groups, before evaluating the investigation. This week in Literacy children have been learning to writing a kennings poem. Children have been working on identifying the verb and the noun to create their own poems.

INFORMATION

Inappropriate use of Social Network Site:

Social medial websites are being used increasingly to fuel campaigns and complaints against schools, headteachers, and school staff and in some cases other parents and pupils. The Governors of Teagues Bridge Primary consider the use of social media websites being used in this way as unacceptable and not in the best interests of the children or the whole school community. Any concerns you may have must be made through the appropriate channels by speaking to the classteacher and the headteacher, so they can be dealt with fairly, appropriately and effectively for all concerned.

In the event that any pupil or parent/carer of a child being educated at Teagues Bridge is found to be using libellous or defamatory comments on Facebook or other social network sites, they will be reported to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of the network site. All social network sites have clear rules about the content which can be posted on the site and they provide robust mechanisms to report contact activity which breaches this. The school will also expect that any parent/carer or pupil removes such comments immediately.

In serious cases the school will also consider its legal options to deal with any such misuse of social networking and other sites. Additionally, and perhaps more importantly in the issue of cyber bullying and the use by one child or a parent to publicly humiliate another by inappropriate entries. We will take and deal with this as a serious incident. Thankfully such incidents are extremely rare.
